Location

Where are things and people located? A location can be absolute (specific) as in coordinates of a map using latitude and longitude, or a location can be relative, as in next door, nearby, or in the same general location as another location.

Place

A place is an area that is defined by everything in it. All places have features that give them personality and distinguish from other places (Physical and Human). If you refer to your school as a place, then that place would include walls, windows, gym, cafeteria, classrooms, people, clothing, books, maps, mops, brooms, hallways, mice (if TMS has them!) and everything else in the school, including languages spoken.

Region

A region is an area that is defined by certain similar characteristics. Those unifying or similar characteristics can be physical, natural, human, or cultural.

Movement

Movement refers to the way people, products, information and ideas are moved. This can be local, such as how did you get to school today, or it can be global, such as how did humans get to North America?

Human-Environment Interaction

Human-environment interaction looks at the relationships between the people and their environment—how people adapt to the environment and how they change it.


